Coursework	25 %		Coursework may include tutorial and online discussions, oral and written presentations, debates, performances, oral reports, in-class exercises, documentary film screenings, and reviews of film clips.

			No single assignment will be weighted more than 40%. Additionally, e-pedagogy pertinent to digital humanities may also be introduced in support of delivery of the course, including gathering and analyzing data via social media and/or other digital tools. Students will be graded on their performative exercises, communicative accuracy, participation and cooperation in group projects, interpretation of texts, and writing competence.
Research Essay	40 %	2, 3, 4	The research essay will assess the student's ability to take a position on a relevant topic, demonstrate conceptual awareness of key issues related to the period, and to analyze one or more literary texts. Students' research essays will be graded on the basis of cogency, originality, organization, usage and grammar.
Examination	35 %	1, 2, 3	The examination will assess students' understandings of the core issues and themes of the period. Additionally, the exam will assess students on their presentation of arguments, analysis of material, coherence of thinking, organization, and writing competence.
