These are designed for students to apply and reflect on their learning through documenting morphological phenomena and constructing simple analyses. When learning about morphology, off-site group work and self-study/access of the HKBU Phonology Lab may be a regular feature of the coursework and its assessment.
Examination	50 %	1, 2, 3, 4, 5	The final examination assesses students' abilities to discuss and analyze morphological phenomena.

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
